It may be helpful to limit screen time at home and encourage students to spend more time reading. This is often most effective when the whole family models the habit—everyone choosing something to read. Consider designating a weekly “quiet reading hour” by turning off electronic devices and enjoying the calm together. Afterward, you can share what you read or even take turns reading the same book and discussing key events. Non-fiction books are also a great way to help students make real-world connections through reading.

Maria Montessori leads us into the new year with the reminder that **“The child who concentrates is immensely happy.”** (The Absorbent Mind). As we settle back into routines, we will continue supporting your children in becoming more independent, resilient, and focused. These habits will serve them well as they take on more challenging work in the classroom.

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
PTO News
